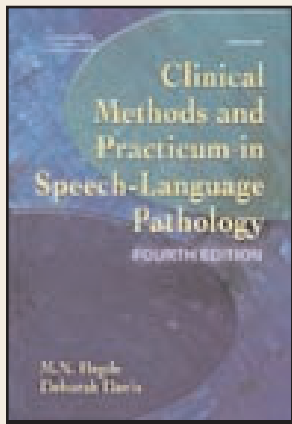


Clinical Methods and Practicum in Speech Language Pathology, 4E

This book is written to define and describe the clinical practicum experience for the graduate clinician and the clinical supervisor in speech-language pathology. It covers a variety of steps in the graduate clinical training process from scheduling clients to behavior modification and treatment methodologies.

The purpose is to provide a comprehensive work of information on the clinical practicum experience while providing clear expectations for both the student and supervising clinician. The objectives are worthy and the authors clearly provide the information in a systematic manner.

This is written for the graduate clinician and clinical supervisor beginning the clinical practicum experience. The authors are credible in their education.

The book is divided into two sections: The Clinical Practicum and Clinical Methods in Speech-Language Pathology. The book is written in a clear and concise manner enabling clinicians to use it as a reference guide. It covers a wide range of pertinent information necessary for a graduate student. This fourth edition adds information on ASHA's requirements and guidelines for certification and HIPAA requirements. It also expands many of the sections from the last edition. The book may also appeal to more clinical supervisors if it contained a greater pool of information geared specifically to the supervisor.

This is a user friendly clinical methods book that would be an excellent resource as a requirement in a clinical experience. It may appeal to more clinical supervisors if it was also presented as a treatment manual with assessment and treatment techniques and reproducibles that could be used by the clinicians in the practicum experience.
