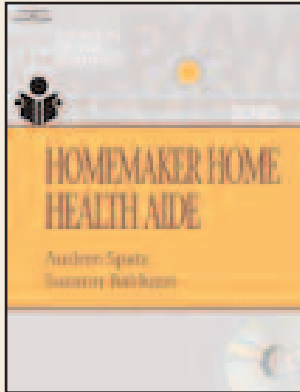


Homemaker Home Health Aide Exam Review

This review is made up of a series of tests on various topics related to home health aide training. Each test is followed by answers to the questions and rationales for the answers.

The purpose is to help prepare a student who has finished a home health aide training course for the national home care aide written certification exam. This review book is a companion to the textbook, *Homemaker/Home Health Aide, 6th edition*. The topics in the book and the test questions overview any content areas covered by the national written exam.

It is intended to prepare one to take an exam based on the companion textbook content (if that book had been used in class) or for the national exam. The author has a B.S. degree in Occupational Education and has been working in the homecare field for the past five years.

The book is divided into three sections. Section one covers services provided by a home health aide and various client populations and tests students on topics from wellness to various disease entities. Section two has tests related to infection control and safety. The last section of tests is based on the physiological systems of the body.

The review covers a large number of topics pertinent to exam testing for home health aides. It also stays with the same basic format of the companion workbook and handbook. This would be very helpful to anyone who is using those books for study in this field and as one source of review for the national exam.
